"Panduru" literally means "stale or dry bread" and it is a company led by two local entrepreneurs that transforms surplus bread from bakeries into delicious pastries, contributing to reducing food waste. Bread is the second most wasted food in Spanish homes. Almost 50 million kilos a year are thrown away, which is about 200 million loaves of bread, becoming an environmental, economic and social problem. Mar de Niebla: Mar de Niebla is a social action foundation located in an industrial area in Gijón. They started their activity in 2014 to generate projects of social interest and to integrate less favoured groups. They will show us some or their project or specific programmes related to reuse: supportive toy shop in Christmas, cell phones
