

An accelerator for regional development





At the heart of EU cohesion policy:

- Improving regional development policies (in particular Structural Funds)
- Mix of more and less advanced regions
- High participation of peripheral regions
- Based on local needs: Importance of stakeholders
- Focus on results: 2 phases of projects (Exchange of experience + implementation)
- **Innovative:** Lump sum for phase 2 (4th Call projects)









Outputs achieved (validated as of June 2019)

Why a platform for interregional policy learning?

Strategic objective =

- Capitalisation of project achievements
- Support to public authorities for policy learning
- Link with the EU ecosystem

How to get more out of the invested funds for regions in Europe

How?

- by bringing projects together
- by getting newcomers on board (i.e. managing authorities and regions not involved in the Interreg Europe projects)
- by offering ad-hoc support for interregional learning (i.e. without requiring project participation)
