European Digital Innovation Hubs




European Digital Innovation Hubs <u>provide</u> to <u>enable</u>


technological expertise

EDIH means more than "DIH 2.0"

Digital Innovation Hubs in Horizon 2020

- €500 million EU funding for DIH 2016- 2020
- Support to more than <u>2000</u> Start-ups, SMEs and mid-caps to test digital innovations
- in collaboration with more than 200 Digital Innovation Hubs across the Et Not bad, but how many companies are there in the EU?
- Coaching more than 60 potential Digital Innovation Hubs in regions with slower adoption of digital technologies, with focus on Central and Eastern Europe

European Digital Innovation Hubs in the Digital Europe programme


- From <u>support</u> to <u>capacity building</u>

What's next?

Call timing: designation process from Member States (almost) completed EU call opening not decided yet, possible opening end of June with deadline beginning of September (it will be the 1st call of Digital Europe)

Cross-border proposals possible, Interreg can have a role here

Funding is shared 50/50 (Digital Europe Programme / Member States) Member States funding can also be from ERDF.

RRF can be used to fund extra hubs beyond those supported by Digital Europe

European Digital Innovation Hubs are the tool to deploy digital capacities. The primary focus is to satisfy the needs of SMEs and the public sector.
