Vlajo – Mini companies



- Students in the two last years of secondary school
- Determine mission and targets, gather funds, write business plan, follow-up on administration and finance
- Goal: students get to know their interests and ambitions
- Entrepreneurship & entrepreneurial skills
- 311 mini companies
- Funding: 60% by Flemish government
 40% by partners (e.g. ECEF)
- 15 € per student
- Vlajo acts as government


