- Management Authority Ministry of European Funds
- Intermediate Body Ministry of Research
- •Intermediate Body Ministry of Information Society:
 - During the two Operational Programmes deealing with Competitivness, the projects supporting the innovations are not strictly addressing the innovation in homecare.
 - -In the current OP there are at least 2 projects dealing with innovative aspects in homecare.
 - -The formulation of the requests in the Applicant Guides does not support directly / strictly the innovation.

Ministry of Health – Programmes Implementation and Coordination Unit

- -The telemedicine was a good practice at pilot level, currently under extension to the country level.
- -Innovation is not clearly considered being associated namely with ITC tools using.

<u>MEEDS BY FORMAL & INFORMAL</u> HEALTH/HOMECARE PROVIDERS



- •the national level organizations for informal care are generally from social service of Orthodox Church, Catholic Church, National Network of Associations for Senior Homecare functioning based on public funds and on grants from special programmes and projects. Solutions are not innovative but still effective.
- •formal providers mainly university hospitals via research projects are identifying the homecare needs.
- •the complexity and the bureaucracy as participant in projects funded under OP discourage formal/informal healthcare providers to participate further in continuing and maintaining the connections with OP's offers.
- •the network in Home Care is efficient via SeniorNet network for long term cooperation mainly due to their initiative to formulate a project of governmental law for homecare of old people. However the needs for innovations are not transmitted officially as there are missing their connection with actors from research and business.
- •ICT tools for health/homecare developed by research operators are not well received all the time and remain as the level of an excellent test application with no further implementation. Projects with telemedicine, robots, emergency care, sensor monitoring of vital signs, beds and equipment, smart homes are considered as potential innovative solutions offer in connection with regional characteristics.

HOW CAN FORMAL AND INFORMAL HEALTH/HOME CARE PROVIDERS BE INVOLVED IN THE COP 2014-2020?



- Increasing the interest in considering innovative solutions developed/applied/implemented internal and external in the medical communities
- A Data base with not used innovative solutions for health/homecare performed in former OP and European Programmes could be useful.
- •AM/IB/ Implementation Unit of COP 2014-2020 should offer a service special for informing on the funds availability for health/homecare use of innovative solutions
- To be activated the QH so that consortium of representative be ready to cooperate in adopting a new solution for Health/homecare.
- •Low rate of structural funds absorbtion should crate a special determination and approach in helping their teams to be involved in innovative projects each year
- •An efficient information and dissemination of existing innovative solutions as well as the success stories from national bodies and abroad
- •COP 2014-2020 could be improved by a more clear GHuide of applicants, by a more rapid and efficient evaluation process, by a clear indication of OP support for innovative solutions in Homecare.
