







RETRACE's first year

The last 1st April, Retrace "A Systemic Approach for Regions Transitioning towards a Circular Economy" project turned 1 year old.

During the last 12 months, the 8 partners of the project from Italy, Spain, France, Slovenia and Romania have achieved many objectives of the project. The main achievements are the following ones:

The Field Visits for the identification and exchange of Good Practices in different countries continue. Recently Retrace project partners and stakeholders have been visiting Spain and The Netherlands to share the good practices active in these regions.

The Third Field Visit was hosted by the Basque partners Azaro Fundazioa and BEAZ and was held on 17 and 18 November. The first day the partners met in Makina-Xemein and found out 4 Basque good Practices. The second day they all were in Bilbao and had the possibility to learn about 3 more Good Practices. Apart from that, interesting information about the Basque Cooperative Movement or the Circular Basque Strategy was also provided. A short video sums up this great experience.

The Fourth Field Visit was held on mid-Frebruary (16 and 17) and all the partners and some stakeholders of Retrace travelled to the Netherlands. 10 Good Practices were presented in the country that is known as the cradle of Circular Economy. Even though this country is not a partner of the project, is considered to be the main spot of wordwide Circular Economy and one of the countries with more experience in this subject.


