
The 'Green Fund' of the Ministry of Environment and Energy aims at

fostering development through financing programs, measures, interventions and actions aimed at supporting the country's environmental policy.



- ✓ In 2016, recognizing the need for sustainable mobility planning in urban areas of Greece, the Green Fund announced a fund for Municipalities that were interested in developing SUMPs
- ✓ A large number of Municipalities expressed interest to develop SUMPs and 150 were selected for funding with ~ 9M €








Maturity Criteria

The maturity of each municipality was assessed and evaluated through specific criteria:


- ✓ Participation in actions and networks that promote environmentally friendly urban planning (i.e. Covenant of Mayors, Civitas network, etc.)
- ✓ Preparation and submission of proposals in national or EU programs to implement sustainable development actions
- ✓ Implementation of National or European projects
- ✓ Actions reflecting sustainable urban planning
- ✓ Actions to promote Urban Sustainable Mobility for Citizens (European Mobility Week)









Recording of current mobility situation














European SUMP Guidelines

A very useful tool providing a structured framework for developing and implementing a Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan



BUT

- ✓ Each Country, Region and local area has its own particularities.
- ✓ **Greek Municipalities' technical departments** are so far focused on the procurement, implementation and monitoring of traffic studies. They **lack capacity and knowledge** to procure SUMPs development and monitor and participate into their development..

Initiative of the Ministry of Transport REFORM Interreg Europe


To support the SUMP development process the Ministry of Transport & Infrastructures took initiative for:

- Establishment of an Interministerial Committee for the development of National Guidelines to enhance the SUMP development
- Establishment of an administrative structure (department)
 dedicated to Sustainable Urban Mobility within the Ministry.
- Organization of information and training activities to decisionmakers & local authorities staff

National Guidelines development



The committee commenced its activities in September 2016 and completed the preparation of the Guidelines in June 2017.

The guidelines describe precisely:

- ✓ The responsible bodies for the establishment of SUMPs
- ✓ The alternatives for defining the intervention area.
- ✓ The basic stages of SUMPs development (in line with the European Guidelines by merging some steps)
- ✓ The minimum required data
- ✓ The synthesis and responsibilities of the key actors and stakeholders
- ✓ The SUMP document structure

The bodies that will be responsible for SUMP development (Municipalities, Association of Municipalities, etc.) will prepare the specifications to procure them.





The Transport Development Directorate consists of the following Departments*:

- a) Department of Transport Design and Development
- b) Supply Chain Department
- Department of Air Transport
- d) Department of Sustainable Urban Mobility



f. Supervise the process of developing Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans and monitor / evaluate their implementation.


The role of Regions



- ✓ The Regional Operational Programmes (ROPs) are the main sources
 for financing the measures and projects that will be proposed by SUMPs
- ✓ In the objectives of each Region and the existing ROPs, reducing air pollution from transport and enhancing sustainable mobility is a key objective.
- ✓ One of the major problems faced by the Regions is the **lack of mature project proposals from the municipalities** that are taking regional planning into consideration and have relevance and synergy with neighboring areas' planning.


