WITH PARTICIPATION OF M.A.I.X. IN A EUROPEAN PROJECT

"Green" buildings with virtually zero CO2 emissions

The Mediterranean Agronomic Institute of Chania (MAIC) is actively involved in the efforts to build "green" buildings.

On 7 and 8 September, the six-month meeting of the partners of the European project ZEROCO2 took place at the premises of MAIX. This project is implemented in the period 2016-2020 with the participation of organizations from eight European countries: Slovenia, Germany, Finland, Lithuania, France, Malta, Italy and Greece funded by the European program INTERREG EUROPE.

The aim of this project is to promote, through appropriate policies, the creation of buildings with virtually zero CO2 emissions due to their use of energy in accordance with the European Directives for the creation of buildings with very low energy consumption and the promotion of renewable energy sources. During this meeting they were presented with inter alia, the various renewable energy technologies that are mature and cost-effective and could contribute to the creation of near zero-energy buildings due to energy use in the participating countries. The next meetings of the project partners will take place in February and March 2018 in Finland and Slovenia, respectively.
