# 1<sup>st</sup> Local Stakeholder Group meeting

## REGIONE EMILIA-ROMAGNA

The Local Stakeholder Group of Emilia-Romagna Region met, for the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting, on 14 June 2017, at the Department for Research, Innovation, Energy and Sustainable Economy, in Bologna.

10 people participated, as representatives of the following:

The meeting started with a presentation about the key features of CREADIS3 project, its objectives, the main activities to be carried out, with a focus on the policy instrument addressed by Emilia-Romagna Region.

The role of stakeholders was explained, specifying tasks in which they will be involved.

The “Guide for Mapping Preparation”, elaborated by the lead partner, was illustrated.

An open discussion started, focusing on the regional policy instrument and how it could be improved, in the framework of CREADIS3 project.

Stakeholders shared preliminary ideas about the 2 steps of the mapping activity, with some proposals and comments.

All participants showed a great interest in CREADIS3, considered as a crucial opportunity for the development of cultural and creative industries in our region.

They also expressed interest in learning by other project partners, sharing best practices in CCI, also by participating in study visits.

It was a very proactive participation, so that stakeholders proposed to meet more than once per semester. They agreed to meet again in July, for discussing in detail the mapping activity and share their inputs and suggestions.
