Ms. Elena Mengotti makes a short introduction to the on-field visit objectives and methodology

- **FVG Roadmap** finalised in May 2017
- **8 goals identified** against the Barriers & Solutions analysis
- Each identified goal is broken down in more **specific activities** for possible future inclusion in the Regional Action Plan
- Active participation of **regional stakeholders** has been essential in drafting the Roadmap
- Aim of the on-field visit is to conduct a **peer review**, taking as a starting point the Roadmap recently drawn up
- Such third party analysis will reveal to be very useful especially in view of the transposition of the Roadmap into the **Regional Action Plan**
- Experts will be called to elaborate **recommendations** to improve the implementation of the CCI support action, included in the ERDF ROP of Friuli Venezia Giulia 2014-2020



After the introduction interviews and exchange of views start: how do we want our Policy Instrument to be and what do we expect in terms of results?

Slovenian and Portuguese experts interview Area Science Park and Friuli Innovazione representatives asking:

Field of competency/specialisation of their incubators, whether theirs are, or are not, incubators focused on CCIs, if it is considered to be easy or difficult to specialise on CCIs, which are the resources the incubators need to do this, to articulate what they are offering, if the incubators have good connections with Universities and the private sector, if a network of incubators exists.

The information collected during the morning session, together with the regional analysis, barrier and solution matrix and the roadmap and the answers given by the incubators' representatives will be used by the experts to draft initial findings and recommendations to be presented during the closed session of the following day, and then discussed and enriched with the contribute of regional stakeholders to draft the peer review report that will be presented to the partnership in the next meeting.
