| Baden Württemberg | 30.01.2018 |        | <p>At this meeting we had 21 participants (including Daniel Buhr and Sandra Evans), and what we are especially excited about was that attending the meeting were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-- 2 representatives from two different ministries of the state of Baden Württemberg, namely the Ministry for Social Affairs and the Ministry of Economics</li> <li>-- 6 representatives from three different county councils</li> <li>-- 2 representatives from the university clinics,</li> <li>-- 3 representatives from three different care organizations</li> <li>-- 2 representatives from two different senior county councils</li> <li>-- 1 representative from an insurance-related care consultancy</li> <li>-- 3 representatives from SMEs.</li> </ul> | <p>At the latest local stakeholder meeting we asked the latest delegates to the various EEPs to provide a quick report about the visits, which were all very interesting for the delegates and should help us recruit further delegates for upcoming EEPs.</p> <p>After the reports the group broke into working groups based on challenges that were voted on during the first stakeholder meeting in June 2017. There the greatest challenges for the health and care sector in Baden Württemberg are a</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) shortage in skilled care workers,</li> <li>2) neighbourhood management and</li> <li>3) sectoral division in the healthcare industry.</li> </ol> <p>In those working groups members had to discuss the challenges with respect to the different topics and think of potential solutions. It seemed as though all delegates were engaged in the discussions and the 45-minute session could have easily been extended. Results of the different working groups were presented to the entire group. While there was unfortunately no time to discuss the results, we did offer to continue the discussions outside of the “official” ITHACA activities and foreseen meetings.
