This was a point of analysis of Małopolska's potential to build a modern health and social care system in the region.</p> <p>The meeting took place in the form of interactive workshops in three thematic sessions in the following areas:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Policy</li> <li>2. Innovation</li> <li>3. Creating a cooperation network (Ecosystem)</li> </ol> <p>During the workshop sessions, the participants first tried to identify the problems, gaps and weaknesses of the social and health care system in relation to the survey, taking into account the point of view of the organization from which they originated. Then, they attempted to identify the good practices and strenghs in the field of health and social care already existing in Małopolska and to answer the question what we already have. The topic of discussion was also social and technological innovations in the field of health and care and the possibility of their support from public policies. The ideas and recommendations gathered during the workshops are an important step towards improving innovation policies for social and health care.</p>
