

2. IPPC Directive (Act No. 76/2002 on Integrated Prevention)



- + Documents provided for ISO 14001 and EMAS certification can be attached to **the application** for Integrated Environmental Permit, to fulfill BAT 1.
- Considered as an additional documents only.
- + Fewer controls by Czech Environmental Inspectorate

- Insufficient support

3. Act No. 167/2008 on Prevention of Environmental Damage



- + Operators with EMAS or ISO 14001 are exempt from the obligation to provide **financial security** for potential environmental damage.
- + National
- Insufficient support

4.Act No. 134/2016 on Public Procurement



- + Contractor can require EMAS or ISO 14001 to be implemented as a proof of a tenderer's technical qualification.
- + encouraging for big companies
- Price of the procurement is bigger than 140 000 EUR, or 5 421 546 EUR (Construction work)
- Disadvantage for SMEs, retailers

5. National Programme Environment funding scheme



- + Funding for **projects** supporting voluntary instruments implementation and EMS certification including EMAS
- + projects for raising awareness, enlightenment and education
- + New document **6/2016**
- + targets **SMEs**, public institutions
- Concrete calls are needed
- Conditions could be strict, unknown
