Description

The second TANIA Exchange Event takes forward work initiated during and after the kick-off meeting on understanding regional needs in treatment of contaminated sites. This event is the second of three exchange events in this first project period, using interactive workshops, expert presentations and study visits to gain in-depth knowledge of the concept, possible applications and challenges to novel techniques for remediation.

The event is designed to compare similarities and differences between the challenges identified at project level in each partner region and to see where partners' priorities lie, in terms of the territorial situation and the policy context.

The event is structured to promote interactive debate and participative sessions. Partner input will be based on the information gathered at regional level within the TANIA Exchange Template.

Day 1: 22nd May 2017 - *Interregional Exchange Event*

Schedule: 0900 – 1730

0900 – 0930: Opening and Review

The session begins with opening talks from the host partners.

It continues with an overview of work carried out from the kick-off meeting, from *Lorenzo Sabatini*, ASEV (Lead Partner) and from each partner (focus on initial overview of activities undertaken to Set the Scene and on Stakeholder Groups).

0930 – 1100: Tania Project Stakeholder Workshop Part 1 – Comparative Input on Setting the Scene

Focus turns to comparative exchange on the work undertaken to *Set the Scene*. Work begins with a comparative presentation of the information gather so far and presentation of the working methodology (*Lead Partner – c.10 minutes*).



Partners then share information gathered on their Territorial Context and Policy Context. Participants are divided into two interregional groups (min 1 representative per region in each group): Territorial Table / Policy Context table. As we are at an early stage in the Setting the Scene work, the objective is not to provide information on aspects of regional analysis. Rather it is designed to evaluate the work carried out so far and share some specific points of interest. Each table will consider the following questions:

1. What methods have you used so far to gather information on the territorial context OR policy context? Is the analysis going smoothly or have you found difficulties? (c.15 minutes)
2. What have you discovered during the analysis (particular points of interest)? (c.25 minutes)
3. What do you intend to focus on in the next stages of analysis? (c.10 minutes)

The session lasts around 50 minutes and each table has a moderator / rapporteur.

The moderator of each group then feeds back to the other group, highlighting the main issues emerging from the discussion, including particular similarities and differences between regions.

1100 – 1130 Coffee Break

1130 – 1300: Tania Project Stakeholder Workshop Part 2 – Comparative Input and Expert Presentation on Challenges

Work begins with two input presentation related to the 7FP project *NANOREM - Taking Nanotechnological Remediation Processes from Lab Scale to End User Applications for the Restoration of a Clean Environment*. This recently concluded project has published a Toolbox and a series of project bulletins, which have a wealth of useful information for TANIA. Amélie Queffeulou, University of Lorraine, provides a summary presentation of the content. Petr Kvapil, PHOTON WATER TECHNOLOGY (*Stakeholder involved in NANOREM*) provides input on the challenges and his company's experience in nanoremediation.

This is followed by open discussion on information gathered in each region on the TANIA Challenges.

Partners use visual aids to show the priorities that they have allocated to each challenge. They then have a short space to provide specific details about that challenge in TANIA regions and suggest any addition challenges to be added.

1300 – 1400 Light Lunch



1400 – 1730: Study Visits

Partners will visit the following, where hosts will give a presentation and then show participants round the sites.

- Pécs sewage sludge plant (15 minute bus drive, followed by c.1.5 hour visit)
- Former Mecsek Ore Mining Company, which have undergone remediation and re-cultivation over several decades. Difficulties experienced during to this work can be an important learning experience for future remediation activities (c.0,5 hour visit)

Optional event: guided sightseeing tour of Pécs, by train.

0900 – 0930: Overview of TANIA Project Communication Activities

Lorenzo Sabatini, ASEV, provides an update on TANIA project communication activities, followed by input from all partners on local communication initiatives.

Jessica Huntingford and Pietro Collini, Resolvo Srl, provide updates on Financial Management and Reporting. This includes a focus on the on-line tool (iolf) that will be used for financial reporting.

The workshop is designed to summarise the knowledge exchanged so far and to look forward to the next steps of project development.

Participants discuss the previous day's exchange sessions and study visit content, sharing their evaluation of the sessions, points of interest and what they have learned.



Focus then turns to the next activities to be carried out within the project.

1145 – 1215: Meeting Conclusions

Participants discuss the 3rd Interregional Learning Event expected to be held in Nancy/Metz in month 10, setting provisional dates and an overview of the points to be covered in the agenda.

They confirm subsequent activities to be undertaken and set deadlines for tasks (To Do List).
