The HoCare ICI responsible presented the project status in parallel with the planned objectives and the results obtained in the 3 Work-packages during the semester 2 and part of semester 3. After a short presentation of stakeholders participant in the meeting and their organization interest in the HoCare project results, the participants were acknowledged about regional analysis, about the interregional thematic workshops, about the formation of quadruple helix within the stakeholder groups for the thematic of the workshops, about the role of ICI in the interregional cooperation and the local interaction with stakeholders for sustaining innovation in the field. The meeting addressed 6 big questions on each one stakeholders being invited to express their point of views.

Management authority experts for the policy in the field of innovative solution for home care by means of good practices exchanges.

The stakeholders and experts from the Health Ministry, Management Authority of Competitiveness Operational Programmes and Ana Aslan Foundation International, were impressed by the results provided by the Consortium and considered that the knowledge and is very useful for each representative of the quadruple helix involved in innovative solution for home and health care of elders. The association of elders in Romania –CARP – was also interested in the results and considered that the openness for the elders` problems health support of the Operational Programs could solve the lack of funds in supporting real needs of elders.

The Romanian Academy stakeholder recommended the ICI team to make more visible the quadruple helix functionality for innovation in the field of e- health platforms.

The stakeholders agreed to continue interacting with HoCare Team and participate as experts during the phase 2 of the project.
