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POLICY INSTRUMENT

ROP 2014-2020, Priority axis 2 – "Enhancing the competitiveness of small and medium-sized enterprises", investment priority 2.2 –

" Supporting the creation and the extension of advanced capacities for product and service development"

MAIN FEATURES

The Policy instrument addressed by the Regional Operational Program 2014 – 2020 intends to **increase the competitiveness of SMEs** and envisages measures to support SMEs older than 1 year to grow in the value chain, gain access to finance, assistance and new markets.

In order to maintain and develop the competitive advantages, the main challenges faced by SMEs are related to the rapid adaptation to the market, continuous improvement of delivered products and services through technologic transfer and innovation, product built in services.

Thus, ROP 2014 – 2020 will support companies with potential to develop/maintain its position on the market by supporting their business operations. In this context, ROP proposes interventions to support the access to international markets, by measures that are not limited just to provide support to participate to fairs and commercial missions, but are linked with actions related to adopting new business models, like investigating the markets of other countries, adapting products/services for certain markets, etc.

The main objective of policy instrument is **to improve the economic competitivity by increasing the labor productivity of SMEs operating in the 10 competitive sectors** identified by the National Strategy of Competitiveness 2014 - 2020. ROP 2014 - 2020 envisages interventions to support the access to international markets, through measures that are not limited to participation in trade fairs and trade missions but are combined with actions related to business modelling, such as knowledge of the markets of third countries, adaptation of products/services for certain markets, etc.

Supporting SME competitiveness in the investment priorities involves measures to address the dependence of economic sectors, their ability to move up in the value chain, to have access to finance and markets, access to relevant know-how and business skills.

Another important point is to create a compartment within SMRDA that will function as one stop shop, which will include information services on the internationalization of SMEs. Also, MySMIS application to have a continuous functionality, without interruptions. Continuous training of the people who are using MySMIS application (Managing Authority, Intermediate Body, beneficiaries) could be an improvement proposed.
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
