Today

- #1: Our drive to produce more, cheaper goods is straining our natural resources
- #2: We struggle to find space and ways to dispose of these items



Electronics

- Huge existing market: \$300 billion is being spent globally on upgrading smartphones, and global IT spend is \$3.5trn (UK: £100 billion)
- Fastest growing segment: In 2017 140 million refurbished smartphones were sold, 13% YoY growth vs. 3% for overall smartphone market






- Globally, over 1 billion smartphones are upgraded every year, but 70-80% are getting binned
- 30-50% of devices being disposed are in working condition

The Future

- Mission: take hassle, cost, and (data security) fear out of dealing with unwanted electronics

- Imagine the future: new devices are made from high quality, remanufactured components
