Description

In Semester 4 TANIA Project Stakeholders (TPS) continue to use interregional and regional exchange to Merge Expertise, thus to deepening identified practical policy **solutions** to (nano)remediation **challenges** and to undertaking a **Gap Analysis** to recognise eventual missing points. To carry on Action Plan development, building on work initiated during TEE4, partners estimate means of addressing identified Policy Needs to attain desired Policy Improvements. Solutions owned within and outside the consortium are discussed to set up potential transfer. Moreover, during TANIA Exchange Event 4 (May 2018) partners asked for a **project development** session aimed at examining potential call for proposals to unfold TANIA findings.

TANIA Exchange Event 5 convenes partners and stakeholders to participate in a series of **interactive sessions** to:

- Address and deepen the solutions proposed (shared prior to the meeting through the Solutions Template - Section 3), and proceed with Gap Analysis to organise bilateral exchange Work Plan for transfer;
- Compare content for Action Plan development;
- See practical examples on novel remediation techniques in the Region of Crete.

Partners will also participate in the **Steering Committee** meeting, addressing Communication and Management related activities.

**Day 1: 08 October 2018 Interregional Exchange Event (TANIA Project Stakeholder
Workshop Parts 1 and 2, Site Visits)**

Schedule: 0900 – 1700

0900 – 0945: Opening and Review

The session is opened by the host partners (Representative of Region of Crete).

Lorenzo Sabatini, ASEV (Lead Partner), continues with an overview of work carried out, of meeting methodology and of Semester 4 work.

Dimitris Dasenakis, Decentralised Administration of Crete, provides a presentation of experiences on Remediation of Contaminated Sites in Crete.

0945 – 1045: Tania Workshop Part 1 – Analysing Solutions Selection

Building on the evaluation of Solutions, partners present their reasons for selecting solutions. Their brief overview is based on 3-Step Action Plan Template, Step 2 – Analysing solutions, particularly Table 1 - TANIA Interregional Exchange on solutions. A template is provided to allow partners their reasons for selecting the Solutions available within TANIA. Each overview is expected to last c.10 minutes.

1100 – 1300: Tania Workshop Part 2 – Deepening Solutions and Gap Analysis

This sessions starts with two presentations to provide further information about a highly-voted solution and a new solution (*sessions of 30 minutes, including presentations and time for questions*).

11.00 – 11.30: **EDP RIS3 Crete**, presented by Stauros Kaoukakis, Directorate of Development Planning of the Region of Crete (implementing Authority of RIS3).

11.30 – 12.00: **The Finnish Ministry of the Environment's guidelines on the risk assessment and sustainable risk management of contaminated soils**, presented by Anne Heimonen, Regional Council of Päijät-Häme / Katariina Lahti, University of Helsinki

These are followed by an interactive presentation, allowing partners to learn more about two Solutions AND an example of possible transfer (on-going):

12.00 – 12.30: **GISFI and SOLIA – Possible Transfer to Tuscany?** Introduced by Lorenzo Sabatini and Jessica Huntingford, with input from Tuscan representatives and from the Solution owners (University of Lorraine and University of Finland)

The session ends (12.30 – 13.00) with an introduction to the **GAP analysis** (3-step Analysis, Step 2 – Analysis Solutions Table 2 - Gap Analysis and Table 3 - Other input to Policy Improvements). Moderated by Pietro Collini (Resovlo Srl), partners provide a brief overview of what they feel is still missing to help solve their policy needs (*this will be referred to again at the end of Tania Workshop Part 3 on Day 2*).

1300 – 1400 Lunch

1400– 1700: Site Visits

Partners will visit the Institute of Electronic Structure and Laser (IESL) in FORTH (Foundation of Research and Development Hellas). Specifically, the visit will take place with the Lab of Transparent Conductive Materials (TCM) Group.

IESL is a Physics and Materials Institute performing high quality fundamental and applied scientific research focused on two main research directions: Laser Science and Photonics and Materials and Devices. TCM Lab works on the study of Metal Oxides for applications ranging from Gas Sensing to Photocatalysis and Transparent Optoelectronic Devices to Smart Windows

During the visit, Dr Binas and Professor Kyriakidis from FORTH Crete will present an advanced remediation technique for the inactivation of micro-organisms and the removal of micro-contaminants in sewage water using innovative nanomaterials.

Partners will have time for questions, comments and discussion through the session.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

ARRIVING IN CRETE

You can fly to Heraklion International Airport: <http://www.heraklion-airport.info/>

There are daily flights from Athens (35-40 minutes flight). The Airport is located 5 kilometres east of the city of Heraklion.

From Heraklion airport you can either take the public bus or a taxi. The taxi to the centre of the city costs around 10 Euros. The bus stop is a couple of mins walk from the terminal building of Heraklion Airport. The buses leave from the airport every few minutes from early morning until late in the evening from Monday to Saturday and less frequently on Sundays. City bus number 78 goes to the Bus Station A in Heraklion, which is 5 minute walk to the centre of the town. Journey time is around 20 minutes and the ticket costs approx. 2 Euros.

Heraklion to Chania is connected by a frequent public bus service from Bus Station A (near the harbor). The buses leave every hour from 5.30am to 9.00pm for around €15 Euro and the journey takes 2 hours and 45 minutes. More information and routes on this link: <https://www.ktelherlas.gr/>
