"makers", Start-UPpers, students, schools, NGO's. Its aim is to create an innovation environment to encourage unlikely encounters to think innovation differently.

The Crunchlab also aims to bring together and coordinate the service offerings of local innovation structures in this rural corner of France. Living Lab, Maker Space, Fab Lab, Co-Working Space enhanced by access to skills, training and innovation events. Crunchlab helps extend the digital innovation ecosystem and interact university-based skills + resources with rural ideas hence the 'Idéation' concept.

Located in the "craftsmen court", the Filature 2.0 will be a place of life and exchanges. Space dedicated to coworking, relaxation, fablab, junior workshop, digital transition, high speed broadband, photos, video studio, 3D scanner, videoconference, confidential office or open-space, training, MOOC, workshps, open innovation, e-hub. This place is dedicated to everyone from general public to enterprises.



The site of the Filature is situated in Ronchamp, a municipality that is part of the local entity "Communauté de Communes Rahin and

Chérimont" and the nine municipalities gather a great historical, artistic and spiritual heritage: Mine museum, House of the "Négritude", the "Planches des Belles Filles".
