Description

In Semester 5, TANIA Project Stakeholders proceed with **Action Plan development** activities. The Seventh TANIA Exchange Event (TEE7) is designed to support this, throughout various sessions examining draft Action Plans and activities to develop them. **Exchange of knowledge** is promoted through a technical session gathering scientific contributions related (nano)remediation and considering the proposal to expand our work to put in place an in-situ demonstration of environmental safety of nanoremediation (presented at TEE6 and in follow up communications).

Therefore TEE7 encourages partners and stakeholders to engage in a number of interactive sessions with the purpose of:

- Bringing into comparison drafted Action Plans to peer review identified Actions, work plans for their implementation, and relevant stakeholders to collaborate with, in order to achieve policy improvements;
- Taking in additional scientific content on the outlook of innovative remediation techniques, analysing interlinked policy implications;
- Exploring activities and technical details to structure the development of the joint project proposal.

Partners will take also part in the **Steering Committee** meeting, covering Communication and Management.

Day 1: 28 May 2019 - Interregional Exchange Event

Venue: Presidency of the Université of Lorraine

Schedule: 0900 – 1740

0900 – 0930: Opening and Review

The meeting begins with a welcoming speech from the host partners (Representatives of Grand Est Region and University of Lorraine).

Lorenzo Sabatini, ASEV (Lead Partner), recalls the present state of the project, introducing the meeting methodology, activities concluding Semester 5 and a look forward to the final project semester.

0930 – 1300: Technical Session – Scientific and Policy related contributions to the common proposal for interregional cooperation to demonstrate (nano)remediation solutions

The morning session is designed to discuss the common project proposal (DINARES) and to provide further scientific and policy content in the realm of (nano)remediation, both in the context of the proposal itself and of the overall TANIA exchange.

Indicative schedule:

0930 – 1015: Introduction

- The session opens with an introductory presentation by Marie-Odile Simonnot (University of Lorraine) of the DINARES Joint Programme proposal for TANIA region collaboration: “in situ demonstration of environmental safety and sustainability of nanoremediation”.
- Q&A on preliminary doubts and feedback from TANIA partners moderated by Jean-Louis Morel (University of Lorraine stakeholder).

1015 – 1115: Session 1 - Scientific / Technical contributions to common proposal, describing innovative remediation techniques currently in implementation

- University of Lorraine, presentation of project(s) related to:
 - Characterisation of nanoparticles; Eco-toxicological impacts of nanoparticles;
 - Chemical remediation of oxygenated hydrocarbons;
 - Chain of diagnostic and remediation processes to deal with complex pollutions.
- Ilaria Corsi (University of Siena), Carlo Punta (Politecnico di Milano) – The NANOBOND project: objectives, testing activities and final results;

- Ville Selonen (Remsoil Oy) - Abattoir waste based product for controlled release of nutrients in bioremediation.

1030 – 1145 Coffee Break Midway through the session

1130 – 1230: Session 2 - Political contributions to common proposal

- Region Grand-Est and University of Lorraine present the case study of the recently released call for proposal for brownfield remediation using innovative remediation. Alongside the description of the call experience, the following themes relevant to innovation and land planning policies are covered:
 - perspectives of nanoremediation development in the partner regions (research, technology, regional policy, innovation policies)
 - funding of reclamation obligations
 - existing compensation systems
 - policy for land consumption
- Other TANIA partners openly participate in a question time about their regional experiences in fostering policy support to innovative remediation moderated by Pietro Collini (Resolvo).

1235 – 1300: Round up conclusions: how the above inputs can contribute to DINARES, the joint programme proposal – open discussion moderated by Pietro Collini and Jean Louis Morel.

1300 – 1400 Light Lunch

14.00 – 1600: Tania Project Stakeholder Work shop part 1 – Connecting the lessons learnt from TANIA to the attempted policy improvements

This session starts with a brief presentation (*Pietro Collini, Resolvo*) introducing the goal of the comparative workshop and its methodology, in the context of the whole meeting. An in depth description of the final Action Plan document is provided to clarify all its sections.

In preparation for the session, each region will prepare 1 poster for each Action included in their Action Plan (template provided by Lead Partner, the hosting region will be responsible for printing the poster(s) in A3). The posters will be displayed from the start of the meeting, so everyone has a chance to see them during the breaks. Following the introduction, partners will have a further 5 minutes each to introduce the posters and ask questions to the Action owners if necessary.

Partners, divided in 2 groups of regions, exchange on the **Background** of the proposed policy improvements. National and regional input, as well as contribution provided interregionally by

TANIA through Solution Transfer, are deepened to determine how the project will feed into the regional policy context, defining Actions. This work builds on presentations from TEE6, demonstrating the changes and updates achieved since then. *More details on the organisation of this session, including a specific role for invited stakeholders, where relevant, will follow.*

1615 – 1745: Tania Project Stakeholder Workshop part 2 – Peer reviews of drafted Work plans

The session begins with a brief overview of the methodology for this session (*Pietro Collini, Resolvo*).

Partners then carry out a peer review of the drafted Action Plans, with particular focus on **activities** to implemented and to be planned in order to achieve policy improvements. The workshop is organised in 2 rounds of evaluations, where partners divided in couples discuss designed work plans and related timeframes. Duos analyse activities already undertaken to put in place Actions since Semester 4, and those to be organised and scheduled to conclude Phase 1. When relevant, Phase 2 implementation activities are also taken in consideration. *More details on the organisation of this session, including a specific role for invited stakeholders where relevant and the Peer Review template, will follow.*

In a moderated plenary session, TANIA partners examine the role to be played by relevant **stakeholders** in implementing the APs and the strategy to engage them in the process, the **financial resources** necessary for the planned activities, how to **monitor** the implementation of the APs, and **risks and contingency** plans. Partners will complete a worksheet about stakeholder engagement (stakeholders engaged and how, any problems with stakeholder engagement, resources need to support Phase 2 activities, and means of monitoring the development of the process). They will discuss the results with their neighbour and then with the group. The worksheet will be provided by the Lead Partner on the day.

The session concludes with a Round Up presentation, with advice on Action Plans and Phase 2, from Pietro Collini, Resolvo.

TRAVEL

In order to reach Nancy:

- from Paris-Roissy Charles de Gaulle (CDG) Airport :

- ⇒ Option 1 : take the high speed train (TGV) from the airport station (*Aéroport Paris-Roissy-Charles de Gaulle*) towards *Lorraine TGV* station

and then take a shuttle bus to Nancy railway station /or a taxi directly to your hotel

Lorraine TGV is about 29 km from Nancy.
