




The trail of senses

- Degree of difficulty: **Accessible path in a wheelchair**
- Distance/Duration: 0.34 km/10min
- Maximum height: 951 m
- Cumulative difference in elevation: 6 m
- Connections with other trails: 2
- **Passengers to this destination: 1.267*** (pass, cash)
- **Connections by TITSA:** : From Sta. Cruz, líneas 2 routes and 5 from La Laguna.




Teide Volcano

- Start: White Mountain Base
- End: La Rambleta - Viewpoint of La Fortaleza
- Degree of difficulty: High
- Distance/Duration: 8.3 km/5h
- Maximum height: 3.536 m
- Cumulative ascent gain: 1,194 m
- Connections with other trails: 4
- **Passengers to this destination: 1.477***
- **Connections by TITSA:** One route from Tenerife North and one from Tenerife South



Limitation of the climb to the Teide cráter:

As a measure to preserve the Teide National Park, the climb to the crater of Mount Teide is limited. You can only walk up from the cableway station and if you have prior permission from the Government of the island of Tenerife, which must be requested through the web page.





TENO Masca

- Start: White Las Portelas
- End*: Masca
- Degree of difficulty: High
- Distance/Duration: 3,7 km / 2h
- Maximum height: 912 m
- Cumulative ascent gain: 1,194 m
- Cumulative descent of descent: 812 m
- Connections with other trails: No (arrival at isolated beach and departure by boat)
- **Passengers to this destination: 646***
- **Connections by TITSA: One route from North**

Communication campaigns and limitation of access in a private vehicle:

To preserve the area of Masca, the use of public transport is encouraged to reach the town, due in addition, there is very little parking in the area. On the other hand, if the descent of the path is made, there are only two ways to get out, going back up or taking a boat to the nearest port.



In addition, in the case of Teno, another area near Masca, due to the dangerousness of the road and rockfall, can only be accessed through the buses of TITSA
