

Apply for a peer-review

Pre-conditions:

- Policy responsibility of the host (local/regional authority, managing authority)
- Readiness to lead and coordinate the process
- Registered member of the Interreg Europe community: https://www.interregeurope.eu/account/registration/

Selection criteria:

- the policy area addressed (thematic relevance for the programme: sustainable mobility, implementation of local climate action plans, energy efficiency measures... and all "Thematic Objective 4" topics)
- the strong motivation of the candidate for a peer review
- the involvement of relevant local and regional stakeholders (if relevant for the addressed policy area)
- the potential for policy impact and follow-up action
- the clarity, completeness and overall quality of the proposal
