REPLACE is an Interreg Europe IV call project, aiming at enhancing the trasition toward a circular economy through the amelioration of regional policy instruments.

The implementation methodology focuses on 4 essential aspects:

- exploitation of the Local Analysis tool to identify the most promising sectors according to (RIS3);
- -the cross-regional value chain approach to combine regional potentialities;
- -the circular economy assessment criteria to evaluate the resulting circular economy proposal;
- -the adoption of the Memorandum of Understanding to finance cross-regional projects;






















TIMELINE
