The coordinator of the ITHACA project presented the Malopolska Action Plan. Then the participants divided into two groups to identify and discuss some challenges in both actions planned in this document.</p> <p>The beneficiaries of the ROP projects worked together with other stakeholders on the list of challenges they face during implementation of their projects. Then all participants tried to find solutions or answers to those challenges – that were based on lessons learnt in the ITHACA project.
