The Route of the Romanesque

The "Romanesque Road", which was created in 1993, is one of the 10 most popular tourist routes in Germany with 1.6 million visitors per year.

The "Romanesque Road" runs through Saxony-Anhalt on the more than 1,000 km long circular route in the form of an "8" with the state capital Magdeburg as the route intersection, connecting 88 selected buildings from the Romanesque era.

Lined up like a string of pearls, monasteries and cathedrals, treasure chambers, village churches, castles and palaces present themselves as contemporary witnesses to a groundbreaking epoch of German and European history in the Middle Ages.

Between 950 and 1250, the region of present-day Saxony-Anhalt developed into a political and cultural centre of Europe under Ottonian rule. More than in almost any other federal state, the legacy of this heyday has been preserved in Saxony-Anhalt in such splendour and diversity.

Shortly before its 25th anniversary in 2018, the "The Route of the Romanesque" was extended by another ten Romanesque buildings. (1 northern route, 9 southern route)









* **Romanesque App:** As a mobile travel guide, the app allows to explore the "Romanesque Road" for travel planning. The contents are available offline after the app has been launched for the first time. The app offers information on the history and architecture of the buildings, festival highlights, as well as suggestions for hiking tours along the "Romanesque Road".

Since 2007, the "Route of the Romanesque" has been part of the European Cultural Route TRANSROMANICA. TRANSROMICA combines Romanesque heritage across eight countries. With this, Saxony-Anhalt is connected to the Romanesque heritage in Spain, France, Portugal, Italy, Austria, Serbia and Romania.






