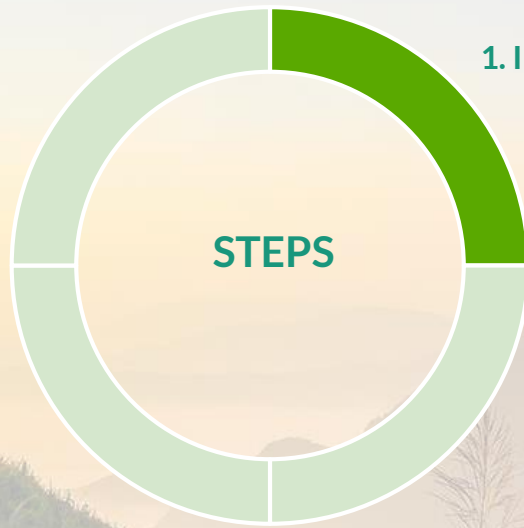

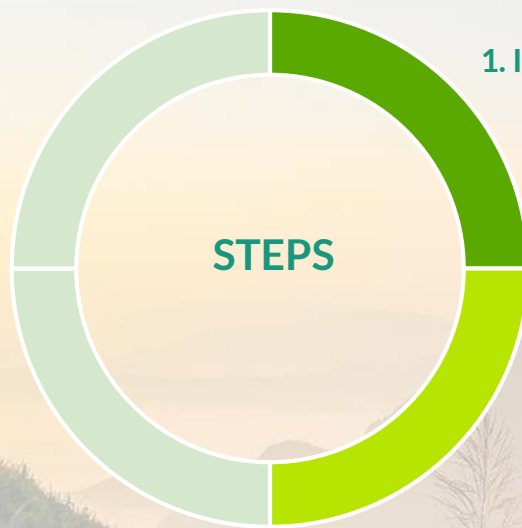

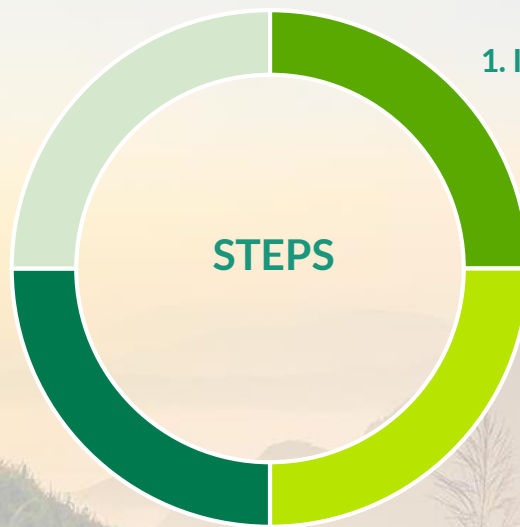

CONSULTATION

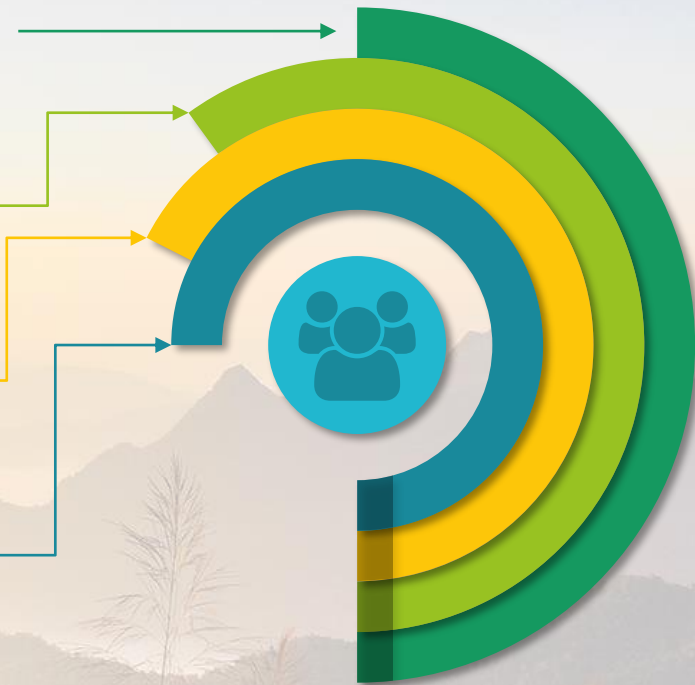
Questionnaires and surveys, focus groups, stakeholders meetings (e.g., community consultations), advisory forums, online forums,...

DIALOGUE

Multi-stakeholder forums, advisory panels, summits, virtual engagement meetings,...
