CARPE DIGEM kicks-off in Nevers, France 24 Sept 2019

Participants from 10 organizations from 7 countries attended the CARPE DIGEM project kick-off meeting at L'INKUB (Digital Accelerator and Hub) in Nevers, France, on 24-25 September 2019 hosted by our Lead partner, the Digital Nievre. This first meeting served as a 'capacity building' event to prepare the partnership to set up, manage and monitor the processes at the core of our project. Each partner presented and reviewed the Partner Territorial DIGEMs (Digital innovation Ecosystems) together with the current social, economic innovation processes, methodologies, tools, policies and strategies and their ambitions and planned strategies to



change them.

At September 26 partners visited the most important regional digital event - SIVIIM ("The Summit of Innovation in Medium-Sized Cities 'Reinventing the appeal of middle-sized cities through digital innovation and transformation") at Nevers and met with participating businesses and public sector organizations, focused mainly at "My free open-source city" topic.

Smart Villages is a new concept that can be instrumental for the development of rural areas. EU rural areas are places of great assets and they can become even more attractive if we enable local actors to unlock their potential. Project meeting: DIGEMs: the Slovenian experience 25-26/11/2019



The 2-nd CARPE DIGEM project coordination and IRSC Meeting was held on 25-26 November 2019 at Slovenia.

The consortium of 10 partners from 8 European countries and stakeholders participated in two-day events discussing the best practices in digital transformation in rural Europe.

The meeting took place in Svečina, a little village on the fringes of the Slovenske Gorice hills and close to the Austrian border at tourist farm of the Valdhuber family (<u>http://www.valdhuber.si/en/</u>).

The region is known for its vineyards and wines. Around 80% of inhabitants are farmers, primarily traditional winegrowers on family farms. Others work



in the service sector such as building construction, electrical infrastructure, carpenters, expanding business also in the larger cross-border Austrian Styria region.

All participants discussed the regional digital transformation solutions.

The webinar, with 80 registered participants, presented partner's digital innovation ecosystems (DIGEM) and their place within the broader context. Particular attention was given to digital innovation ecosystems and their hubs, smart villages and digital transformation.

The seminar was chaired by assistant professor Emilija Stojmenova Duh who also led the plenary session on digital innovation ecosystems. Technical support of the event was provided by the University of Ljubljana, Faculty of Electrical Engineering, LTFE.





The seminar was divided into two parts. Within the first, partners presented and shared the experience of how the development of smart villages, Industry 4.0, can be supported by the development of digital innovation ecosystems.

The accent was put on tourism, cultural industries, public administrations and rural innovation digital ecosystems. Some of the partners shared practices developed as a response to the challenges brought about by the corona virus pandemic.

Donegal Digital ecosystem is a public-private partnership formed by 8 permanent organisations, including public authority, Institute of Technology and development agencies. Following challenges in County Donegal (Ireland) are found:

- Need to expand the Letterkenny cluster to other areas within the County
- Securing staff with the required skills and experience
- Low levels of research activity and adoption of emerging innovation approaches needed
- Challenging provision of quality and sustainable public services

2.Build upon the strong foundation of the Letterkenny digital cluster to create new enterprises
