Cultural heritage funding is one of the biggest challenges in ensuring heritage sustainability. Conservation activities as well as appropriate management of cultural heritage is expensive. If done properly, it requires large amounts of funds since it often requires specific techniques, materials as well as skills to keep the asset in as much as close to its original condition. At the same time, it has to be managed in a way that allows its current use. This poses financial challenges, which are among the top of all challenges relating to cultural heritage. Practice, luckily, shows that different funding sources may be applied in securing funding both for heritage conservation as well as its operation. Once funding is secured, appropriate management needs to be applied as to ensure heritage sustainability. Practice has shown, unfortunately, that poor governance as well as poor management may be equally detrimental as the lack of funding. This requires appropriate policy frameworks ensuring the proper governance models as well as business and management knowledge and skills by cultural heritage managers.

The workshop "Financing, Business Models and Governance of Cultural Heritage Interventions" organised within the Interreg Europe KEEP ON project aims to provide inspiration for ensuring financial and management sustainability of cultural heritage assets. Gained knowledge may be used in enhancing policy instruments under which heritage projects are funded as well as in action plan development with the appropriate measures aimed at ensuring heritage durability and sustainability. At the same time, it may serve as an inspiration to cultural heritage managers as well as decision-makers in ensuring sustainable policy frameworks and management models for their heritage assets.
