The Project


ThreeT seeks to improve the performance of 8 policy instruments to protect and enhance natural and cultural heritage by setting up **thematic trails** or improving existing ones, making them **accessible** to all through **green modes of transport** and **readily available information**.

Expected **impacts** on partner territories are:

- New trails established
- Existing trails strengthened
- Improved economic conditions and increased employment opportunities
- Enlarged participative cohesions among institutions and local stakeholders
- New proposed modes of protecting and enhancing natural and historic-cultural assets

Continuing to share partner experiences

During the period from June to November 2020 the partners, together with their stakeholders, decided to overcome the obstacles to their meeting in presence by organising and attending 5 Tutoring Sessions online. A suitable platform was set up, presentations made, discussions recorded for future utilisation together with supporting materials.

ThreeT experience-sharing has come into the open!



Action Plan Outlines

On 30 November all partners submitted their Action Plan Outlines to the Joint Secretariat of INTERREG EUROPE for initial evaluation. The Action Plans include a series of strategically combined actions which capitalize on experiences exchanged during Study Visits and Tutoring Sessions over a 18 months.



Each Action Plan includes two or more main activities ranging from natural, cultural and industrial heritage valorization, exploring and enhancing the theme of silence, introducing innovative solutions for sustainable transport, testing new governance methods. Partners are attempting to model new or remodel existing practices by drawing from the examples given in the other partner regions.

Partners will commence their individual Action Plan implementation starting in Spring 2021. They will monitor the Action Plan performance until end 2022 and will compare results in that period when they meet for the project Final Conference in Malta.

What next?

The year 2021 will overview the finalization of the 8 Action Plans and the dissemination of their strategical opportunities in a joint conference of all partners in Finland in April and local conferences in each partner regions. In the second half of the year all partners and their stakeholders will endeavor to kick off their Action Plan implementation by securing access to funding opportunities of the EU programming period 2021-2027 as well as from other sources.
