The project concerned improvement of existing policies and regional strategies for both SMEs and entrepreneurship in the local food sector.

The SMEs in the local food sector are micro SMEs that have low involvement in clustering, cooperation and innovation.

Through improving policies, the participating regions emphasized on encouraging entrepreneurship and innovative actions concerning the use of local food.

#### Recommendations for the local food sector

- Establishment of a Regional Structure for the development of entrepreneurship Entrepreneurship Observatory / RTDI
- Establishment of a **Regional Business Centre** that will include an Exhibition Centre, a Regional Innovation Pole, a Business Incubator and a Conference Centre.

The project brought together 7 local and regional authorities from 7 countries throughout Europe. Its ambition was - to address the crucial issue of food waste,

- to stop an unacceptable situation which causes the loss of up to 50% of the agricultural production that keeps not consumed or is consumed in a wrong way regarding health concerns,
- to demonstrate that food waste could be at source of a resource efficient and environmentally friendly economy for the territories.

Local and regional authorities partners worked together, exchanging their experiences and learning from each other, to promote in their territories eco-innovation to reduce food waste, as a way to move toward a smart sustainable and inclusive growth.

These public authorities have committed themselves to improve their own policies Also a group of local stakeholders was actively involved



#### RESULTS

It was the **first time** that Food Waste was raised as an issue in regional level

Actions proposed included the support of food enterprises in the implementation of innovative practices and / or research and development that result in the reduction of food waste.





#### Specifically 2 activities were proposed:

- ACTIVITY 1: Reducing food waste at the source: innovative practices and development of new or existing production lines for the valorization of food waste or residues that are produced from the productive process.
- ACTIVITY 2: Re-use of products which are considered today to be unusable or could not be sold: Innovative practices for the valorization of food waste resulting from the development of new products.
