

Action Camp #02

Discussions on Action Plans for an inclusive governance to foster Urban Farming



On 19 Jan 2022 the 2nd Action Camp was held online by the CityZen partners to present and discuss elaborated versions of their regional **Action Plans**. Partners discussed and exchanged experiences on key questions to strengthen urban farming and foster inclusion of stakeholders. The discussion also focused on the **impact of Covid-19 lockdowns** on urban farming. There is an increased demand of plots and opportunities to practice urban farming by citizens after the lockdowns. The top 5 votes for support measures to be launched by local regions and municipalities include:

- better access for households to urban farming plots in urban areas;
- small grants to launch urban gardens in neighborhoods;
- free access for urban growers to farmers markets;
- rental schemes for basic infrastructures to start urban gardens;
- tax reduction for commercial urban farmers.


A regulatory framework to be set by the local authorities is the key condition to develop urban farmig activities.

Urban farming pilot projects in Castilla y Léon

The **Natural Heritage Foundation of Castilla y León** has implemented the 6 pilot projects included in the Cityzen Project as objective for the Regional Policy Instrument improvement.

The aim of these pilot projects is to integrate urban farming at degraded soils restoration projects, many of them old and small construction and demolition waste landfills. The six selected landfills were located at the Provinces of Segovia, León and Palencia, at the region of Castilla y León. A total of **176 volunteers** have participated during the months of November and December 2022 in various tree planting tasks in six sites.


